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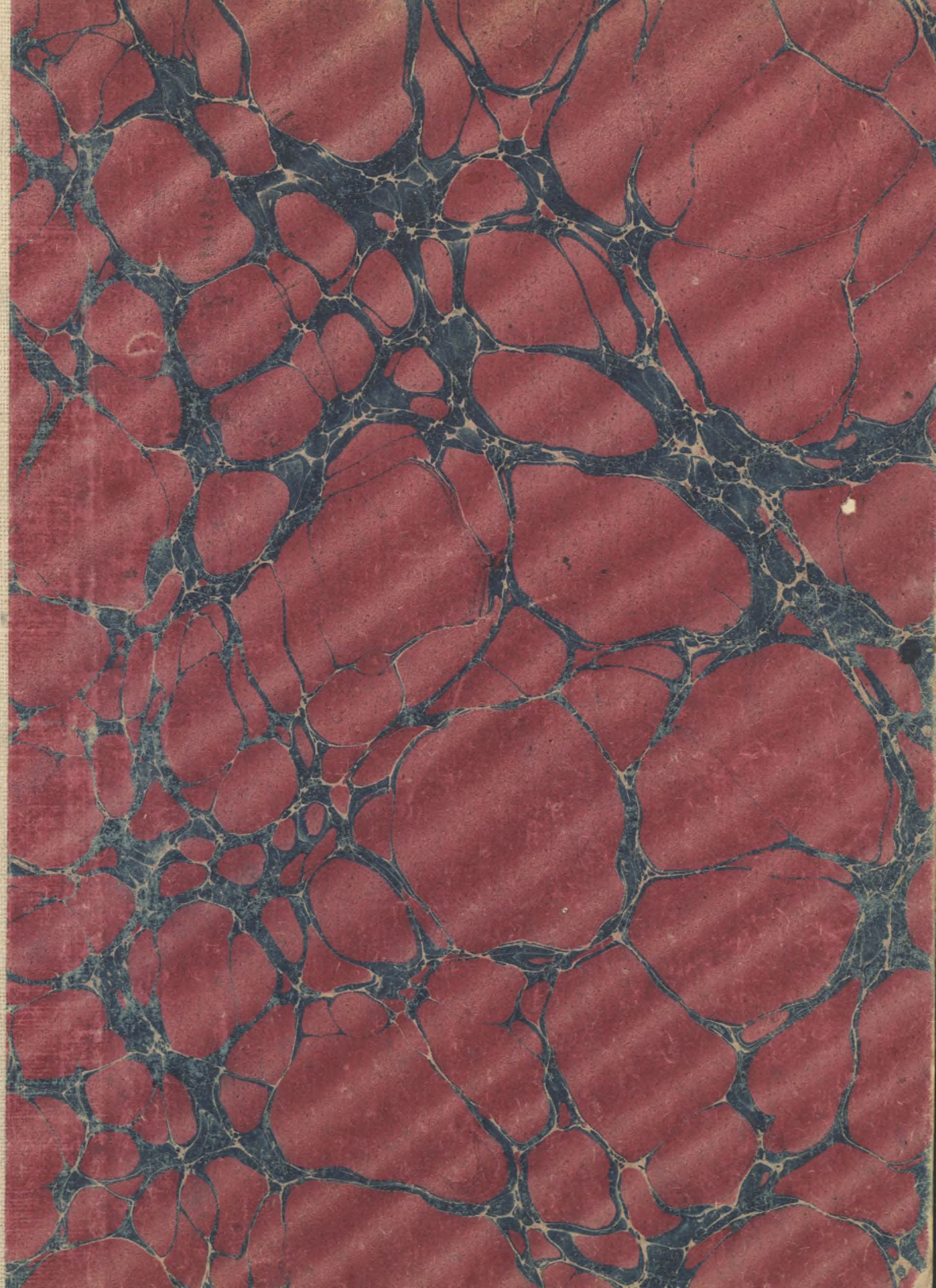
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DIARY OR LOG-BOOK.

EDUCATION CODE, SCHEDULE IV.

Regulations as to School Records.

1.—Every school must have:—

- (a) A Diary or Log-Book, which should be a bare record of the events which constitute the history of the school.

The Log-Book should be stoutly bound and contain not less than 300 ruled pages. It must be kept at the school under the care of the Head Teacher. He should enter in it, from time to time, such events as the introduction of new books, apparatus, or courses of instruction, any plan of lessons approved by the Board, the visits of managers, absence, illness, or failure of duty on the part of any of the school staff, or any special circumstance affecting the school that may, for the sake of future reference or for any other reason, deserve to be recorded. The Log-Book should contain statements of fact only, and no expressions of opinions on conduct or as to the efficiency of the school are to be entered in it except as provided in *Art. 23*.

Entries in the Log-Book should be made by the Head Teacher as occasion may require. Entries should be made only by the Head Teacher, by the Correspondent, by the Managers who check the registers, or by the officer (if any) authorised by the Local Education Authority.

The Log-Book should contain an explanation of the reason for the closing of the school on all occasions on which it is closed. It should also contain an account of all important variations in the attendance, and all deviations from the ordinary routine of the school.

CODE.—Chapter IV.

Art. 23.—Any Report on the school sent by the Board to the Local Education Authority, or to the Managers, together with any remarks made thereon by the Board for communication to the Local Education Authority, or to the Managers, must as soon as received be entered in full in the Log-Book and signed by the Correspondent.

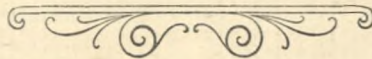

The improvement in aims and methods of this school mentioned in the last report has continued. The older children are by no means lacking in intelligence; their interests outside ordinary school work are being extended and stimulated, one result of which was seen in their ready response to tests in History, Geography and General Knowledge.

Since the last visit all branches of English teaching have further progressed. The children shew more concentration and power to work alone. The work is carefully tested by the Head Mistress' terminal examinations which are held three

times a year.

A record of the questions set was available at the time of inspection.

Needlework appears to be taught on practical and attractive lines and the output of the work is quite creditable for the type of school. One of the

older girls was wearing a drill tunic which she had made herself at school.

The infants' class is in charge of a monitor. The Head Mistress carefully supervises her work.

The Reading of the Standard I is well up to the average, but the class I infants are less satisfactory.

Further ways of adding interest and variety to the methods of teaching this subject and Number were discussed.
