Having met with great inconvenience in passing up &
down the road leading from the Woodbury Post Office to Ashen Tree
on the Exmouth road to meet the mail with the letter bags I found
it necessary to write to the Post Office authorities complaining of
the obstructions, and am requested by Mr Tesdale the Post-
Master of Exeter to ask you (being Waywarden or Surveyor of
that road) in his name & for him to kindly see to the re-
moval of the obstructions complained of & that nothing
impede the free passage of the Mail Bags on the above road.
The obstructions complained of are the occasional overflow of water
at Gillbrook, at Scotsman Gate, at & near Lower Benmoor & other
obstructive matter at Lower Benmoor making the road dangerous
to pass up & down in the dark.

By taking such measures as may prevent their future occurrence you
