Twinning

The dawn of a new era, which was spawned by the creation of the European Union, brought with it a desire to get better acquainted with our continental neighbours.

Devon in particular was a leader in this process, and at that time Devon County Council appointed a twinning officer for Devon called Frank Claxton. He was instrumental in the setting up of a contact between Woodbury and Bretteville-sur-Odon in Brittany. Several exploratory visits took place by a newly formed twinning committee, to make sure we were compatible, prior to the signing of the Charter on Easter Saturday 25th. March 1978 on the village green, with due pomp and ceremony. On 22nd. October of the same year a reciprocal Charter was signed in Bretteville, followed by a champagne reception in the Mairie. We subsequently named a road "Bretteville Close", and the French named one of their roads "Avenue de Woodbury". Since then the twinning association has flourished with many visits both ways.










