This soon had them laughing until the local men got the fence down to come & find us. (They were frightened too!)

Because of concern for the safety of the belfry we took children to the Digger's Rest - but their electricity had gone, so Mrs Pyatt and the students played games in the darkened windowless skittle alley whilst I contacted parents to take the children home as they were all safer with their parents.

THE BEGINNINGS OF WOODBURY SALTERTON CHURCH & SCHOOL

These are some extracts from a letter written to the Rev. C. H. Chase on July 7th, 1907, by John Walling, who was the first schoolmaster.

Dear and Reverend Sir,

I spent a quarter of a century of my life in Woodbury Salterton, which was perhaps the happiest part of a long life.

Miss Marianne Pidsley, seeing the utterly neglected state of Woodbury Salterton, was advised by the Revd. Aaron Wecke of Kingskerwell to open a school, which she did, in a cottage; at first, with one schoolmistress; after, with a second. The cottage proved too small, and a master was necessary. I was recommended, and although scarcely 18 years of age, I was appointed. Preparations were made for building a new school, and the site obtained. It became obvious that a church was much needed, as it was quite a task to take 150 children or more to Woodbury twice a day on Sundays, although the smaller ones were not expected to go in the afternoons. At that time, Miss Pidsley clothed 100 boys and girls.

The site intended for the school was used for the church, and a small orchard, now the burial ground, was purchased - practically given - from Mr. Putt, the lord of the manor. The busy work commenced. The old tithe barn was purchased from the Vicars of Exeter Cathedral and all the farmers in the district assisted in drawing the materials free of charge. Some considered the stone was enough to build two churches, but alas! there was great waste in working, and a sandy foundation on the North side of the church swallowed up a large quantity. Stone was obtained at Exmouth, quarried at low water and taken to Lymstone, then carted to the site. The inside walls are built of Babbicombe limestone, and the chancel arch constructed of HeavyTree Sandstone.

I assisted the ladies in painting the windows - Mrs. Thorneycroft painted all the figures. I did the scrolls, which occupied us about ten months. The glass was burnt by Beer in Exeter. The letters in the windows are from Westminster Abbey. I painted all, with one exception. This was a great undertaking, in addition to other duties, from 5 or 6 a.m. to 9 p.m.. Miss Pidsley chose all the texts

save the two verses in the west window, which I suggested.

At the time of the building of the church, my wife was occupied early on summer mornings in working the back of the chair in the chancel. It was worked on canvas through cloth, and it was impossible to draw out the canvas - I had to cut each thread with a penknife. Lady Rolle once took her brother, Lord Clinton, and asked my wife to uncover her chair; turning to her brother, she said, "There, Charles, I have seen a great deal of needlework, but never any to equal this."

All the work was begun and carried out with much prayer. I trust the Lord's blessing will rest abundantly upon you in all your endeavours to promote His honour and glory.

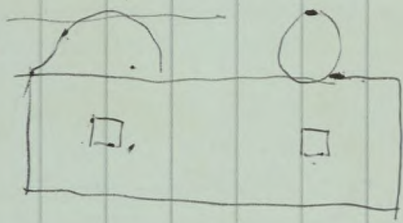

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

It was a pleasure to spend an afternoon in this Aided Church School, where the children continue to receive sound religious instruction in a very happy atmosphere.

I was pleased to meet the Headmaster, Mr. G. Dearnley, who commenced his duties in the school last January.

The inspection began with an Act of Worship, which was carefully arranged. The children took part reverently.

The Infants were a young class, but they answered my questions readily and accurately. They had a good knowledge of the Life of our Lord, the seasons of the Church's Year, the parts of the parish church, and the meaning of Holy Baptism.

The Juniors were responsive and they answered the questions well. Some of the older ones gave particularly thoughtful answers, which shewed that the teaching is being carefully related to the everyday life of the children. I was interested to see some of the note-books which the children keep.




REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

This Aided School continues to provide a good syllabus of Christian Education under the Head Teacher, Mr. G. Dearnley. In addition to the more formal work, some of the parish clergy visit the school to pursue instruction along thematic lines. The current term has been occupied in an exploration of the theme "courage", and the children have considered this in various aspects and situations, leading, it is hoped, to a demonstration and understanding of courage in the Passion drama.

The children have done some interesting practical work, ample evidence of which is to be seen on the walls of both classrooms. The BBC morning service for schools is regularly heard.

Accommodation, particularly in the infant department, is becoming something of a problem, and it is hoped to provide a mobile classroom in the playground to relieve the congestion caused by increased numbers.

The Diocesan Inspector very much enjoyed his visit. He hopes the thematic approach will continue to be used to stimulate the children's interests and understanding, and also that the particular emphases and enrichment which a Church School can provide in education will remain very much in evidence.

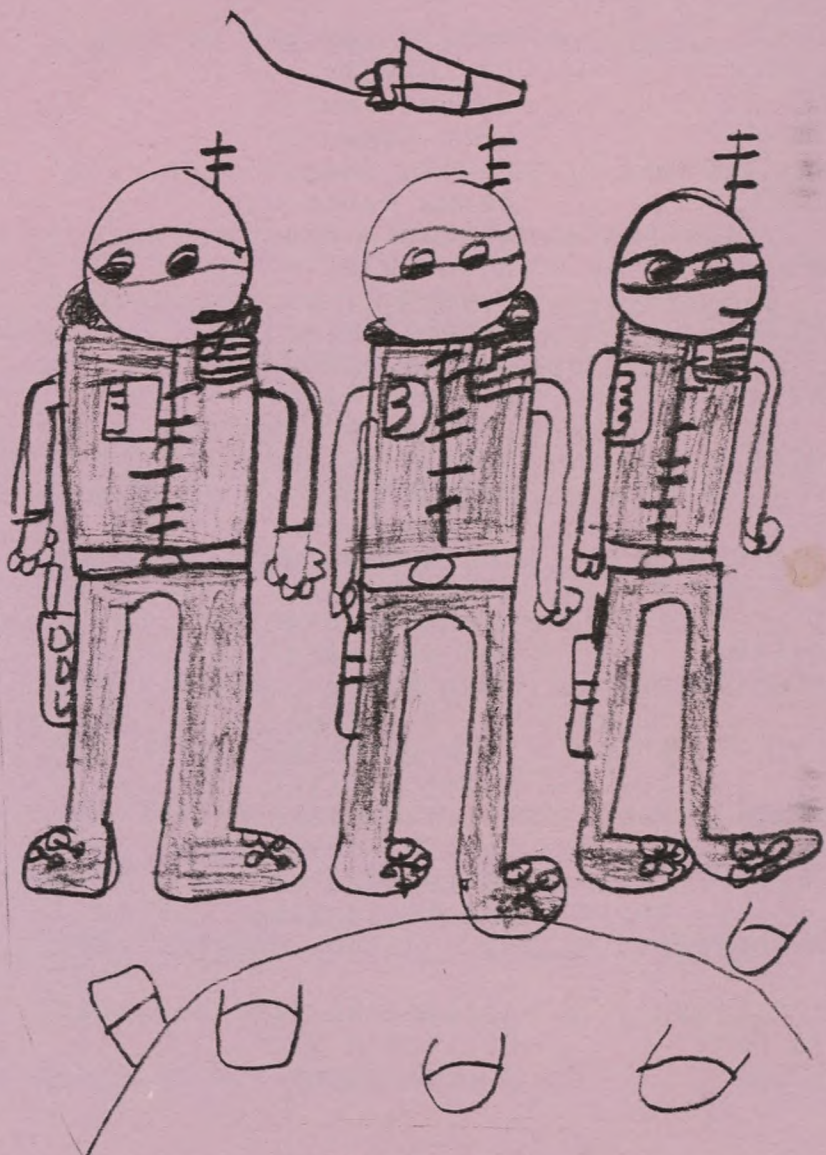

As you have rightly guessed there was more than one Beavis family involved in your extracts:-


17 Apr 1866 - (Alfred) - we haven't traced yet,

THE LOSS OF WOODBURY SALTERTON SCHOOL TREE

When the giant Cupressus Macrocarpa tree was uprooted in the great storm it was an occasion for both sadness and relief for the pupils and the villagers. It was indeed to sad to see the great tree which had been a village landmark for so long and the school emblem lying on the ground by the giant hole excavated by its roots. There was relief though that no-one had been injured as the tree fell at possibly the best time, when all the children were finishing their lunch in the main building and the infant room, which was enveloped in the branches, was empty. The tree which was 30 metres tall, had a girth of 6 metres and a root ball of 6 metres diameter completely blocked Stoney Lane and the topmost branches touched the new extension of the village hall, fortunately no workmen were there at the time. The school gates and fence were completely demonished and had the tree fallen at 3.30p.m. when families were milling round the gate there would have been a major tragedy.

By a strange co-incidence the junior children had been working on a play about the destruction of trees and wildlife habitats. One of the lines read." The tree is shaking, there is a great storm coming." This was written only a few days before and proved uncanilly prophetic.

The tree is believed to be well over a hundred years old, possibly dating from the school's foundation in 1847 and has been the school emblem for many years. The children marked their sadness at its demise by wearing their sweat-shirts inside-out as a sign of mourning. The memory will live on as long as the familiar navy and green shirts are worn. The staff at the school would like to thank parents and people of the village for their support, particularly Mr.Chris Bond, the Pring family and others who helped to make the playground accessible and Mr.Tony Pratt who gave us a refuge in his skittle alley until parents could be contacted.
